



Join us for a 1.25-mile walk at Reservoir Park! This Walk With A Doc program is designed to provide some general health information and a moderately-paced walk around Reservoir Park and the National Civil War Museum including a portion of the Greenbelt. The group will meet up in the parking area of the National Civil War Museum then walk the 1.25-mile loop around Reservoir Park and the National Civil War Museum.

This walk is on paved roadways, but there are some elevated areas. The full walk is estimated to take about 45 minutes based on the pace of the walkers. We encourage you to come out and join the walk for as long or as little as you are able. All ages are welcome to attend, but we do ask that children be accompanied by a responsible adult. Dogs are welcome as long as they are on a leash.

FALL STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION TIPS

Raking leaves onto a stormwater inlet creates more pollution of local streams and waterways. Not only do leaves contribute to stream pollution, they can cause localized flooding if they clog storm drains and pipes. Help protect nearby waterways from excess nutrients and never rake leaves into a storm drain.



Pid You Know

Leaves can be a great source of nutrients for your property, so consider mulching them into fertilizer for your yard or garden. However, a decaying mat of leaves on your lawn can expose it to mold and disease. If your lawn is covered with more than 50 percent of decaying leaves, consider bagging or composting leaves, rather than mulching.

Leaf Pick-Up Schedule for 2025

To get rid of the leaves from your property, sweep them into the street at the curb, during the week when your section of the Borough will have them collected. Please do not call the Borough Offices to have your leaves picked up, they will be collected on the schedule below. The dividing line between the North and South sides of the Borough is Walnut Street. If you are living north of Walnut, including the north side of Walnut Street, use the North Side Schedule, if not, use the South Side Schedule.

Collection will be starting each week below. The starting day for each week is listed below.

North of Walnut Street October 6th & 20th November 3rd & 17th December 1st South of Walnut Street October 13th & 27th November 10th & 24th December 8th

Notice: All future pick-up of woody waste by the trash collectors will be on the 4th Thursday of each month from April to October, and 11/21/25

Leaf collection ends after the first snowfall, or December 11th, whichever comes first
